Group 1 Education

According to UNESCO Japan, there are 58,000,000 children worldwide that are unable to attend school. 781,000,000 adults cannot read nor write. Why can't these people receive an education? There is no one answer to this question. In this discussion group, we will discuss the reasons for lack of access to education potential solutions to the issue. We will also consider our own educational environments.

Group 2 The Environment

Due to environmental damage, climate change is taking place According to the Japanese Ministry of the Environment, the average temperature has risen by 0.85C from 1880 to 2012. Water levels have also risen 0.19m since then. In this discussion group, we will consider the present situation, learn about the mechanisms of global warming, and see if there is anything we can do to help the environment. Let's think about the future of our planet!

Group 3 Tourism

TWhat will be the tourism of the future? Hospitality for the next generation?]

Tourism is an industry that's becoming bigger and bigger. Due to globalization, however, we can also experience different places and cultures right from our own home. In this discussion group, we will consider the tourism of the next generation, discuss potential future issues, think of new tourism styles and materials, and figure out how to create a tourism experience that cannot be experienced without going and seeing for yourself.

Group 4 Disaster Leadership
