【What are the concerns of foreigners?】

(We understood two big concerns from the interview with foreign evacuees on April 17)

- Fear of earthquakes and possibility of another Earthquake (mental/emotional problems)
- Cannot live in their damaged houses or apartments



【Cause of uneasiness】

- They have never experienced earthquakes in their countries and they do not know what expect in future
- Most of the information about the disaster they got on TV or at the evacuation sites was only in Japanese.
- They felt sense of isolation at the evacuation sites because all of the others were Japanese people

【Materials and food distribution】

- At first, there wasn't any way for evacuees at the KIF Evacuation Center to receive relief supplies from the government because the KIF Evacuation Center was thought to be a temporary evacuation site to provide necessary information about other evacuation center for foreigners who could not get any information.



- We made an appeal through the internet for materials (drinking water, food, tissue paper, diapers and halal food for Muslims)



- Many relief materials arrived from groups and individuals who support foreigners all over Japan, including foreigners and people of Japanese descent. Food and drinks which Muslims could eat such as Halal boxes as well as disinfection tissues which did not contain alcohol were also delivered
- With the cooperation of Kumustaka Association for Living Together with Migrants, food was distributed daily until the KIF Evacuation Center was closed. (Hot, nutritionally balanced food played a big role in the health care for evacuees and encouraged them a lot.)
