The weather has been very hot lately. It is important to wear a mask to prevent COVID-19, but be aware that wearing a mask when temperatures and humidity are high, increases the risk of heat stroke. It is not necessary to wear a mask when running or walking outside, commuting to work or school. When it is hot, do not hold back and turn on the air-conditioning, and drink water frequently even if you are not thirsty. Watch out for heat stroke, we've got a hot summer ahead of us!

There were 87 consultations received at the Plaza in June. We share some of them with the advice from the Plaza.

- Q:I am currently working with a 'professor' visa status, but life is difficult and I would like to find a part-time job.
- A:We introduced Plaza job consultations (2nd Wed. of the month). When working part-time with a professor's status, you need to apply for a permit.
- Q: The school would like to talk to the parents about the situation of the students and their home environment, but as they do not speak much Japanese, they would like an interpreter to be sent to the school.
- A:Interpreters can be arranged. Please contact the Plaza.
- Q: What if I am thinking of moving but have no guarantor? A friend of mine offered to be my guarantor, is this a problem? I'd like to know the conditions for a guarantor.
- A: Some real estate companies work with guarantee companies to ensure that housing can be rented without a guarantor. (e.g. Kosugi Real Estate).
 - In addition, a company called GTN (Global Trust Networks) is in the rent guarantee business. https://www.gtn.co.jp/
 - If you have any problems or questions about housing, come to the Plaza's Housing Consultation. (3rd Wed. of the month, 13:00-16:00)
- Q: I would like to know more about daycare for my child, who will be 5 this year, including information about nearby daycare centers and their availability.
- A: Ask the health and children's section of the ward office where you live and they will tell you which kindergartens and nurseries are nearby. You can also search the Kumamoto City Marriage and Childcare Support Website to see the availability of each nursery school and kindergarten.

Obon

Have you ever heard of the word 'Obon'? It is an event in summer to honor the spirits of ancestors. The period varies slightly from region to region, but is generally 3 or 4 days from 13-15/16 August. Many companies are on holiday during this period and many people return home like New Year, and you may have seen reports of traffic jams on motorways and congestion at airports and on bullet trains. People returning home gather with family and relatives for a meal or get together with local friends. They also go out to tourist attractions and enjoy leisure. Traditional Obon ceremonies involve the followings.

●13th(the first day)

They visit their family grave and in the evening, a "welcoming fire" is built to welcome the ancestors. The fire is built in the hope that the ancestors will not get lost...

●14th&15th

During Obon, ancestors' spirits are believed to stay at home shrine and fruits, sweets and festive meal are offered to them.

●16th (the last day)

offerings are made in the morning. When it gets dark in the evening, a 'bonfire' is lit to send them off. The Daimonji Yaki in Kyoto is one of the famous ones.





Another common Obon event is the Bon Odori dance. It is said to have its roots in the Nenbutsu(a Buddhist chant) dance, which was performed to comfort the spirits of ancestors. People wear yukata and dance to traditional music. The dances are usually simple. So if you see one in your neighborhood, why not join in?



HINOKUNI MATSURI



It's summer and in Kumamoto it means time for HINOKUNI MATSURI! This year, for the first time in 3 years, it'll be held from 5-7 August for 3 days. The "OTEMOYAN SO ODORI Dance" on the last day of the festival is the main event, with around 60 groups and 5,000 participants before COVID-19. You used to be allowed to join the dance on the spot but this year you have to book in advance. This year's SO ODORI Dance is scheduled for Sat. 6 August, the 2nd day of the event. For more details, visit https://kumamoto-guide.jp/hinokunimatsuri/ No trams or buses run from the SUIDOCHO intersection to the City Hall during the SO ODORI Dance. Note that it's not possible to drive through. A night market will be held at Sakura no Baba Josaien near the Kumamoto City International Center every Saturday from 5pm to 8pm during the summer holidays (23 July-20 August). Go round the stalls and enjoy the Japanese summer tradition!
