August is coming to an end, but the weather is still hot. Do not hesitate to turn on the air conditioner, as heat stroke is more likely to occur when the heat is unbearable. If you use a fan before turning down the temperature of the air conditioner, you can cool the room with less energy. Give it a try.

The Plaza received 82 consultations in July. We share some of them with the advice from the Plaza.

Q: I have a fever and want to have a PCR test.

- A: If you have a family doctor, contact them first. If you do not have one, phone the call center (0570–096–567) and they will refer you to a nearby clinic where you can be examined. If you have a difficulty in speaking Japanese, call the dedicated foreign language support number (092–687–7962).
- Q: From a property agency in Uto who has Vietnamese tenants: Are there any leaflets in Vietnamese on Kumamoto City's rules for disposing of waste since there's none published by Uto City?
- A: Kumamoto City's waste disposal rules are available in four languages (English, Chinese, Korean and Vietnamese). The information can be found on the website of the City of Kumamoto.
- Q: I was tested positive for COVID-19 from a medical institution, but I have not heard from the health center. What should I do?
- A: Currently, due to the high number of infected people, it is taking a long time to contact them. They are contacted by SMS or telephone (landline), except in emergencies or if they have an underlying medical condition.
- Q: Consultation from a Japanese student. I want to have opportunities to communicate with foreigners for the future.
- A: We introduced the cross-cultural café (where you can learn about the languages and cultures of the USA, Germany, Korea and China) and the Smile Station (Global Communication Act), which are held at the Kumamoto City International Center.

Chu-shu no Meigetsu(Mid-autumn moon)」

^rChu-shu no Meigetsuj is the moon visible on the night of 15 August in the old Japanese calendar. It is around September/October in the current calendar, this year on 10 September. This is an event people watch the beautiful moon and eat ^rTsukimi dangoj. The Mid-Autumn Moon originates from a Chinese custom. It is believed to have been introduced to Japan in the Heian period (710 - 1192). Originally in Japan, the month on this day was called 'Imo Meigetsu', and harvest festivals were held to offer taro as an offering. This was

combined with Chinese customs and adopted as an event to give thanks for the autumn harvest and to pray for a good harvest and good health in the following year. The most common moon-viewing offerings are tsukimi dango and silver grass. The meaning of the offerings is: Tsukimi dango : to express gratitude for the agricultural harvest and to cel

Tsukimi dango : to express gratitude for the agricultural harvest and to celebrate a good harvest. Silver grass: To give thanks and pray for a good rice harvest and to ward off evil spirits.
