

PLAZA NEWSLETTER (JULY, 2023)

As we enter July and the rainy season ends, summer begins in earnest. As the weather gets hotter, we will be using air conditioners a lot. A little ingenuity will save energy. For example, you can improve cooling efficiency by using a fan (circulator) to keep the indoor temperature constant, setting the air conditioner at 28°C in summer, and closing blinds and curtains. I hope you all give it a try this summer.

The Plaza received 79 consultations in May. We share some of them with advice from us.

Q : I came to Kumamoto on a short-stay visa. I came to the hospital for treatment of a chronic disease and was hospitalized for a few days. Is there a way to enroll in the Japanese National Health Insurance?

A : You cannot join the program for a short-term stay, as the condition for enrollment in the National Health Insurance is that you are registered as a resident of Kumamoto City (or the respective municipality). Your own country's insurance may be able to provide a refund after you return home. Please check it out. (Although there are conditions, there are cases where refunds can be handled under Japan's National Health Insurance or Social Insurance. However, this is not possible if they have traveled for the purpose of medical treatment.)

Q : I had to take a two-month leave from work to temporarily return home because a family member in my home country became ill. During that time, there was no income, but I have to pay the rent incurred during that time. In addition, since I came back with my spouse, I will need to pay for living expenses for both of us. Is there any place that will give me a loan of money because I have more living expenses than ever before?

A : Plaza does not provide loans. We have advised to consult with the Kumamoto City Council of Social Welfare and the Kumamoto City Life independence support center.

Q : Where can I get a my number card?

A : How to apply for a My Number Card: (1) By mail (2) Via smartphone (3) Via computer (4) Go to the local government office . If you want to apply at the office, you can do so at the Kumamoto City My Number Center (counter 26 at the Chuo Ward Office), each ward office (East, West, South, North), Kumamoto City My Number Card Chuo Ward Satellite (Sakuramachi Kumamoto B1F), Kumamoto City My Number Card East Ward Satellite (Yume Town Sampian 3F). 「Shosho・Taisho」

This month's topic is 「Shosho(Light heat)」 and 「Tasho(Great heat)」 . In Japan, each of the four seasons are divided into six parts and named them so that the changes in the seasons can be recognized. This is called "Nijushisekki(24 seasons)" July is the month of 「Shosho」 and 「Taisho」 .

Shosho(Light heat)...around July 7 to 22. It is the time when the rainy season ends and summer begins. We send "Shochu-Mimai"(summer greeting card). We send cards to those whom you cannot see easily or you are indebted to, wishing them good health during this hot season. When you write Shochu-Mimai, you begin with "Shochu omimai moshiage masu" (Greetings to you during the summer). Do not end the sentence with a "." at the end of it.

Why don't you try sending one or three?



Taisho(Great heat)...after Shosho, from around July 23 to August 7. It is the hottest season of the year.

We eat eels to get over the heat on "Doyo no Ushi no Hi" (Midsummer day of the Ox) and this year it falls on July 30. Let's eat eels and get over the hot days.

Course guidance for foreign students & parents/guardians in Kumamoto

An information session on further education will be held for students with foreign roots and their parents/guardians. The Kumamoto Prefectural Board of Education High School Education Division will explain about the differences in entrance examinations and tuition fees between public and private high schools, as well as the special entrance examination measures(*) for people from foreign countries. Parents/guardians and students can consult to teachers about which high school they want to go to. Chinese, English, and Korean interpretation will be provided. Participation is free of charge. The deadline for registration is Tuesday, June 20, 2023.

- I decided which high school to go to after reading the career path materials I received from junior high school and guides to various high schools, and after many discussions with my teachers and parents.
