PLAZA NEWSLETTER (May, 2023)

The new school year has begun, and it is a time when new things start for many, entering a new school or a university and so on. The weather has become warmer and more comfortable.

Every year around this time, there is a place in my neighborhood that smells very nice, and I always walk around wondering what this scent is, but I finally found out what it is! The scent is from trees of winter daphne. As people say osmanthus in autumn and winter daphne in spring, it is one of the three major fragrant trees and has been popular as a tree heralding spring for a long time. Did you know about it?

The Plaza received 61 consultations in March. We share some of them with advice from the Plaza.

- Q: I am currently a student. I have been in Japan for 10 years and would like to apply for permanent residence. Tell me about the procedure.
- A: The immigration consultation (an administrative scrivener takes consultations) is held at the plaza. The administrative scrivener advised: One of the requirements for applying for permanent residence is to have lived in Japan for more than 10 years, of which at least 5 years must have been in Japan with either work or resident status. In this case, since he will be changing his status of residence to Engineer/Specialist in Humanities/International Services in April, he has been advised that he first aim for a Highly Skilled Professional, before applying for permanent residence.
- Q: I am a technical intern. I am going to work for an Australian company and have been told to submit an English translation of the year-end adjustment (5 pages). Can you please translate them into English?
- A: Information on private interpretation/translation companies were provided.
- Q:I am a Japanese national, can you tell me what the procedures for an international marriage. I am also concerned about whether my foreign child-to-be will be able to learn Japanese and whether the school is prepared to accept.
- A: We advised when the plaza's immigration consultation days (when you can consult with an administrative scrivener) are scheduled. As for information on the Japanese language support for foreign children, we introduced the Kumamoto City Board of Education in addition to "Orugatta Station" and "Orugatta Kids" at the Kumamoto City International Center. Orugatta Kids is now accepting participants. See page 3 of this newsletter for details.

Eighty-eighth day

This month, we introduce "Eighty-eighth day".

May 2nd is eighty-eighth day which means 88 days from the first day of spring called "Risshun".

Tea made from new buds picked at this time of year is called "shincha" or "ichiban-cha" and characterized by its high nutritional content and fragrance. It is said that drinking shincha (newly brewed tea) will prevent illness and prolong one's life.

Eighty-eighth day is also an important time for rice production.

The character for "88" in "KANJI(八十八)" is combined to form the character for "rice (**)" so it is said that if you sow seeds on eighty-eighth day, you can harvest delicious rice in the autumn.

There is a song about picking tea.

Summer is approaching, it's the eighty-eighth day of spring.

Fields and mountains have all turned green.

Look at the women there picking tea leaves.

Wearing sedge-hats and red cloth bands

to pull back their sleeves.
