PLAZA NEWSLETTER (January, 2025)

The end of the year will soon be upon us. Do you eat TOSHIKOSHI SOBA (buckwheat noodles served on New Year's Eve)? Also, do you know why we eat it? In my family, we eat TOSHIKOSHI SOBA every year. I have never thought about the reason for this habit but I suddenly wondered and looked into it. There are various theories, but its history dates back to the Kamakura period (1185-1333). In the period, temples served buckwheat cakes to those who were too poor to celebrate the new year. The following year, those who ate the buckwheat cakes had better luck, and a rumor spread that good things would happen if they ate the cakes. The theory is that it was then eaten on New Year's Eve. Today's TOSHIKOHI SOBA has a variety of meanings, with wishes such as "to live as long as soba" or "to cut off bad luck like soba", which is easy to cut, and "welcome the next year with good luck". Let's all eat TOSHIKOSHI SOBA and stay healthy and well into next year!

Now then, allow us to partially introduce the consultation details found in our plaza. We received 68 consultations in November and have shared below examples of questions and answers. Some content has been edited for privacy concerns.

- Q: I am an international graduate student. I would like to find a job in Japan after graduation next year, but I cannot speak Japanese. Should I study Japanese at a Japanese language school after graduation and then look for a job?
- A: In order to get a regular job in Japan, business level Japanese language skills are essential(Japanese level of N2 or higher. N1 or higher is even better). Most companies require Japanese language proficiency for computer-related jobs, so it is necessary to first study Japanese after graduation and acquire Japanese language skills at or above a business level. For English teachers, it is not the case for some English conversation schools and international schools, so it may be possible to get a job after graduation. Japanese language classes are also held at the Kumamoto City International Center.

- Q: I am an international student. I will be entering another vocational school next April. Do I have to go through immigration procedures?
- A: The Immigration Bureau says you need to notify them that you have changed schools when you enroll in the next one. Also, before your current residence card expires, you should apply for an extension by getting the necessary documents from the new school you are going to and the one you attended before that.
- Q: My wife is German. Is there a German community in Kumamoto? Also, are there any language (German) events that children can attend?
- A: There is no German community in Kumamoto, but every Wednesday from 13:00 to 17:00, a consultant(city international relations coordinator) from Germany offers German consultations. Come if you want to talk or discuss anything about Germany or in German. In addition, a German Cafe and a Kids' Cafe for elementary school students are held once a month. There is also a "Foreign Wives' Association" that is open to all nationalities as a community for foreign residents.

How to dispose of large garbage

Kumamoto City collects burnable garbage twice a week and other garbage I-2 times a month. When you throw out garbage, you put it in the garbage bags designated by Kumamoto City, but how should you dispose of large garbage that does not fit into these garbage bags? In this issue, we will introduce how to dispose of large garbage, a topic that is frequently inquired about at the Plaza.

Example of large garbage

- Furniture such as wardrobes, desks, beds, etc.
- futon or blanket
- suitcase

[When you want to dispose of large garbage]

- (I) Call "Gomi Zero Call" in advance.
- ② Discuss the collection point, etc., and receive a "Receipt Number".
- 3 Buy a "Large Garbage Disposal Sticker" at a convenience store.
- Write the "Reception Number" you received on the "Large Garbage Disposal Sticker".
- ⑤ Place the sticker on the garbage you want to throw away.
- 6 Put out the garbage at the collection point.
