PLAZA NEWSLETTER (January 2026)

2025 is ending. What kind of year has it been for you? Looking back, there were many events, but the Osaka Expo was particularly exciting. Also, Japan's first female prime minister taking office became a major topic. Attention is likely to focus even more on Japan's political developments going forward.

Regarding next year, we have an important announcement about the Plaza. From Tuesday, January 27, 2026, to Friday, March 6, 2026, the Kumamoto City International Center will be closed for electrical equipment renovation work. During this period, access to the International Center will not be possible, so in-person consultations will generally be suspended. Telephone, email, and online consultations will continue as usual. However, if you contact us in advance, we may be able to arrange consultations at an alternative location. Please inquire for details.

Thank you for reading the Plaza Newsletter throughout the year. We hope you enjoy a relaxing holiday season. We look forward to your continued support in the coming year.

Now allow us to partially introduce the consultation details found in our plaza. We received 88 consultations in November and have shared below examples of questions and answers. Some content has been edited for privacy concerns.

- Q: Please tell me about the required documents and timing for the pension withdrawal lumpsum payment.
- A: To receive a pension, you must have a 10-year qualifying period. Receiving a lump-sum withdrawal benefit will reset your qualifying period to zero. Please be aware of this if you may return to Japan in the future. The following three documents are required:
 - ① A document showing your pension number, such as your Basic Pension Number Notification (a copy is acceptable)
 - ② A copy of your passport

 ③ A copy of your bank passbook and cash card
 To request a lump-sum withdrawal payment, download the form from the Japan Pension
 Service website or obtain it at a pension office. You must submit your request within two
 years of returning to your home country. Please complete the procedure after submitting
 your change-of-address notification at the city office. Withdrawal lump-sum payments are
 subject to income tax (20.42%). To receive an income tax refund, submit a "Tax Agent
 Notification Form" to the tax office before returning to your home country. After
 requesting the withdrawal lump-sum payment, they will send the "Notification of Decision
 to Pay Withdrawal Lump-Sum Payment" (this can be sent to outside Japan) approximately
 4 to 5 months later. If you wish to have this notification, required to receive your income
 tax refund, sent to your tax representative, please attach a separate "Power of Attorney"
 to your withdrawal lump-sum payment request form.
- Q: I want to dispose of my bicycle. Please tell me how.
- A: Bicycles are considered recyclable materials and should be treated the same as empty cans and bottles. Place them at the garbage station by 8:30 AM for collection by the city's garbage truck. Please attach a label marked "Unwanted Items" in a clearly visible location. In Kumamoto City, collection is free and does not require an appointment.
- Q: My wife and I came to Kumamoto for a short trip of about two weeks. During our trip, my wife had to be hospitalized urgently, so we ended up staying in Kumamoto for a while longer. This means we now need to renew our visas. What should we do?
- A: According to the Kumamoto Regional Immigration Bureau, they need to prepare the application for extension of short-term stay and the necessary documents. Since they do not speak Japanese, they advised that they should come to the Immigration Bureau accompanied by someone who understands Japanese.

What's "FUKUBUKURO"?

Have you heard of "FUKUBUKURO"? It's a Japanese cultural tradition where mystery bags containing unknown items are sold at bargain prices during events like the New Year's first sales.

The thrill of not knowing what's inside until you open the bag after purchase, combined with the cost savings compared to buying items individually, makes it a great bargain. It also serves as a way to test your luck for a prosperous new year.

The contents vary widely, including clothing, sundries, food, cosmetics, and more. They are sold not only at department stores and brand shops, but also at electronics retailers and drugstores.

It is said that merchants began distributing good fortune to customers in hopes of prosperous business. The name "FUKUBUKURO" (lucky bag) is said to have originated from the belief that the bag held by DAIKOKUTEN, the god of fortune, contained many treasures.

Lucky bags, a traditional custom dating back to the Edo period(1603-1868), remain beloved by many today. Recently, however, they have diversified, with some sold with their contents revealed. Why not try your luck with one sometime?
