Please stay hydrated and take a rest in a cool place. We also have typhoons in September. Typhoon brings strong wind and heavy rain. Typhoon information is available on TV and internet.

We will introduce the number of consultations in July. The total number was 87. We had many consultations on entry procedures and residence status, job hunting, and interpretation and translation.

Regarding entry procedures and residence status

• I am working in Kumamoto. I want to apply for Permanent Resident in future. Can you tell me the necessary documents I must collect and criteria I must meet?

• I will apply for Permanent Resident. Can you help me collect the required documents and write application form?

Regarding job hunting

• I came to Japan as I got married to a Japanese. I want to look for a job. Can you help me write resume in Japanese?

• I am doing a full-time job with ESI (Engineer/Specialist in Humanities/International Services) status. I want to do a part-time job to make more money. Can I do that?

• I am a permanent resident and doing a part-time job. I want to find a full-time job. Can you help me?

Regarding interpretation and translation

• In order to change residence status, I want to ask a public scrivener for advice. But as I cannot communicate well in Japanese, can I request an interpreter?

• I received a document from Immigration Services Agency of Japan. But I cannot read Japanese well. Can you translate the document?

Regarding COVID-19 related inquiries

• I will return to my country in August. Can I take coronavirus vaccine before leaving Japan?

• Though I reserved coronavirus vaccine, I am pregnant. I heard that the pregnant person cannot take the jab. I want to know if that is true or not. Where can I check the information? Information about the vaccination is available on our website.

Traffic Safety:~Bicycle~

Do you ride a bicycle? Though you do not need a license to ride a bicycle, you must follow the traffic rules like when you drive a car. Unless you follow the rules, you will get caught for traffic violation. When you get caught, you must pay a fine. According to Kumamoto Prefectural Police, bicycle accident accounts for 20 % of the traffic accidents in Japan.


We will present 5 rules to ride a bicycle safely. Please remember them when you ride a bicycle.

1 You must ride a bicycle on the road.
2 You must ride a bicycle on the left side of the road.
3 Sidewalk is for the pedestrians and you must ride a bicycle slowly on the driveway side.
4 Please follow the safety rules.
4 You cannot ride a bicycle after you had alcohol.
4 You cannot ride a bicycle with more than 2 people.
4 You cannot ride a bicycle side by side.
5 Turn on the light when it gets dark.
6 Never ignore the traffic light.
4 Please practice pause and safety check.
5 Never use smartphone while you are riding a bicycle.
6 Kids must wear a helmet.

Thus, there are various rules we must follow in riding a bicycle. Please check the rules and share them with your family members to enjoy a safe ride.
